We have hired 3 new full-time Paramedic/Firefighters, that will give me some relief so I will not have to cover the open shifts and ensure that we have full staff to respond when an emergency does happen. We were also able to fill the opening in the Police Department and are now back to full staff in that department.

The Road Commission was able to complete some road projects for the Township this year. As we all know there is a lot more to be done and the cost of these projects has increased dramatically over the past few years. With only collecting ¼ mill (approx. \$60,000) for roads, this does not go too far. I get calls on road repairs quite often and wished I had a better answer, but the money isn't there to cover many more road repairs.

The Fire and Police Departments continue to provide quality service to the residents that we can all be proud of and rest assured we are getting the protection they provide. Thank you!

Tax Bills

Payment for the 2024 Winter Tax Bills will be due by Friday, February 14, 2025. The last day for Somerset Township to collect 2024 property taxes, before they are turned over to Hillsdale County as delinquent, is February 28, 2025. After February 28, 2025, Delinquent Tax Bills must be paid to the Hillsdale County Treasurer. The Treasurer's Office will be open on Friday, February 28, 2025 from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm for the last day of tax collection. A drop slot is available during regular Township office hours and is located inside the Township building under the Treasurer's window. If you would like a receipt for your mailed tax payment, you must include a selfaddressed stamped envelope. Taxpayers must keep the Township updated on Name/Address changes and/or corrections. Failure to receive a Tax Bill does not negate the responsibility for payment. Taxes may be paid in person at the Township, or online by credit card at Somersettownship.org -->Services Tab --> Pay Tax Bill

Dog Licenses

Dog Licenses will be available at the Somerset Township Treasurer Office December 1, 2024 through February 28, 2025. You must reside within Somerset Township and provide current rabies vaccination certificate. Dog Licenses must be purchased separate from your tax bill.

Drain Assessments

Drain Assessments are special fees landowners and municipalities in a drainage district are legally obligated to pay to cover the cost of maintaining, improving or establishing a designated county drainage system.

Properties located in a Drainage District, are noted on your tax bill as one of the following: Brown #217, Fisk #140, Lake Somerset, Lake LeAnn.

As I reflect on the year 2024, I am pleased to inform our residents that the department is once again back to its original staffing level from two years ago. The department was able to hire and sponsor Officer Keegan McKenna to the Washtenaw Police Academy where he completed his training and graduated on September 6th of this year. This is a milestone for the department as the department and township have not sponsored an officer to a police academy since the beginning of the department in 1977. Officer McKenna is a local resident with ties to the township. As of this letter he is currently conducting

department training to allow him to be successful for the department and the township. If you see him or have an interaction with him, hopefully a good one (LOL), please welcome him to the township. Further the department is continuing to update its equipment, vehicles and training to better provide for the township residents.

Again, with this time of year and hunting season on us, remember to use caution as our four-legged friends are on the move. If you see one, plan on two being there. If you are involved in a vehicle crash, just contact 911. Also with that being said, remember that with the winter months come possibly dangerous road conditions due to snow and ice. PLEASE REMEMBER TO SLOW DOWN AND LEAVE EARLY IF YOU NEED TO SO AS TO PREVENT A VEHICLE CRASH.

Also, as a reminder, if you are planning on leaving the township for vacation, winter get-away or even a short trip, you can contact the township librarian, Ms. Kim Bedard and request your property to be checked on by the department in your absence. Just stop into the township hall and fill out the property inspection form, make sure to note your department date and return date, and contact information for a person that can be contacted in your absence just in case we find an issue with your home while you are away.

Last thing is contacting the Police Department. Please remember that in order to contact the Somerset Twp Police Department if it is an emergency call **911**. If it is a non-emergency do not contact the department office as it is normally not manned, as the on-duty officer is normally on patrol and may not get you message for several hours. So for non-emergency calls, please contact the **HILLSDALE COUNTY CENTRAL DISPATCH NON-EMERGENCY NUMBER 517-439-9913**. The dispatcher will take your information and contact the on-duty officer and have the officer contact you to handle your complaint. If you only have information to give to the department, you can contact the department office at **517-688-9223 ext -312** and leave the information.
